## How to add "phonetic guides" to text in Windows XP?

The feature is only available if support for an East Asian language is enabled through Microsoft Office Language Settings.

(Note: To add pinyin in phonetic guides in Windows XP, you must right-click in the language bar, select Settings, click Add, under Input language, select Chinese (PRC), click OK, then under Keyboard, Chinese (Simplified) – Chinese Pinyin IME 3.0 will appear.)

Change the language bar to Chinese (PRC). Use pinyin input to type in Chinese. Select the text to which you want to add phonetic guides. On the Format menu, point to Asian Layout, and then click Phonetic Guide. In the Ruby text box, enter the phonetic guides that you want to apply to the selected text. Do any of the following:

- To change the font or font size, select the option you want in the Font or Size box.
- To change the alignment, select the option you want in the Alignment box.
- To change the offset from the base text, select the distance you want in the Offset box.

To delete phonetic guides, select the text to which a guide has been applied, click Phonetic Guide again, and click Remove All to delete the text in the Ruby text box.

The character formatting set to the selected text will not change when you add or delete phonetic guides. You can set character formatting after you apply phonetic guides, but if you apply formatting (e.g., bold) to text with phonetic guides, the phonetic guides will take the same format. To change the format of text with phonetic guides, delete the phonetic guides, change the formatting, and then reapply the phonetic guides.
